NEW STAFF JOIN THE TEAM

Reflecting CTE's ongoing commitment to evangelism, mission and communications, two new staff joined the team, following Jim Currin's retirement in June 2019. Ben Aldous now oversees CTE's work in the areas of evangelism and mission, and Lucy Olofinjana manages our communications and media engagement.

ALL ECUMENICAL OFFICERS CONFERENCE

For the first time we brought together over a hundred National, County and Denominational Ecumenical Officers for training and consultation at the same event. This model will be followed again in autumn 2020.

LAUNCH OF PENTECOSTAL ANTHOLOGY

A product of two theological conferences, *Pentecostals* and *Charismatics in Britain – An Anthology*, was published in April 2019. Edited by Joe Aldred and forwarded by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the book explores the historical and theological development of these movements in Britain and beyond. The book can be purchased from SCM Publishers, online and in bookshops.

WHAT IS CHURCHES TOGETHER IN ENGLAND?

Churches Together in England (CTE) is the national ecumenical instrument supporting and encouraging churches from a wide range of traditions to work together in unity. Churches work together at national, intermediate (county) and local levels, and CTE enables churches to be more active in ecumenism at all three levels.

Nationally CTE works alongside 51 Member Churches, who come together twice a year as our Enabling Group, and there are six Presidents. In counties and cities across England, intermediate ecumenical bodies exist. They support, resource and encourage over 2,000 local Churches Together groups and 900 Local Ecumenical Partnerships, as well as the innumerable ways in which local congregations work together informally. CTE provides training, resources and support for County Ecumenical Officers across our nation.

CTE's vision is to create a space in which fruitful collaboration and mutual understanding can grow, so that we as churches work more closely together to share in God's mission – making the gospel of Christ better known in our nation, worshipping together and working together for the common good.

We also work in close collaboration with the other national ecumenical instruments: CTBI, Cytûn (Wales), ACTS (Scotland) and Churches in Ireland.

CTE CELEBRATES ITS 30TH ANNIVERSARY

Founded in 1990, CTE will celebrate its 30th anniversary in 2020, with events to be confirmed.

REFRESHED WEBSITE

A new CTE website will be live from the latter part of the year, with more good news unity stories to tell.

MISSION CONFERENCE

In March we hold a major consultation on evangelism, mission and discipleship, *Discipling the Whole Church, Reaching the Whole Nation*. Bringing together Member Churches, charities, theological colleges and youth agencies, we will explore how we might collaborate in reaching England with the good news of Jesus Christ.

ECUMENISM, THEOLOGY AND ETHICS

CTE will enable continuing conversations about the impact upon our ecumenical pilgrimage of theological and ethical diversity.

ORTHODOX-PENTECOSTAL DIALOGUE

A one-day seminar will be held in April 2020, exploring the experiences of the persecuted church and how mission is being done in challenging circumstances around the world. CTE Presidents Pastor Agu Irukwu and Archbishop Angaelos will co-chair the day.

ONGOING WORK INCLUDES:

- Providing opportunities for relationship-building, particularly among Member Churches, Ecumenical Officers and Bodies in Association (organisations working ecumenically)
- Supporting churches working together at a county and local level
- Resourcing and training Ecumenical Officers
- Inspiring Member Churches to collaborate in **mission**
- Hosting Co-ordinating Groups on key issues, including mission in rural or new housing areas, and evangelisation
- Facilitating the Pentecostal and Charismatic Leaders Forum, with leaders from more than 20 denominations and agencies uniting to build relationships and collaborate
- Writing, speaking and presenting papers
- Hosting seminars, workshops and conferences on topical issues
- Telling good news stories of churches working in unity, shared through Twitter and our monthly mailing CTe-News
